

About that Blower...

The Society is grateful to the organ curatorial team and the City of San Diego's Parks & Recreation Department for their fast and efficient work to repair the 70-plus year old Spencer Turbine after it shorted out late in September. As the motor was being rebuilt, Sunday audiences were treated to an extensive "show and tell" presentation on how the Spreckels organ makes its music. Meanwhile the 1500-pound blower was removed from the Pavilion and brought to Sloan Electric, where the motor was re-wound and the apparatus reconditioned. On November 8 the repaired equipment was re-installed and tested in time for a concert the following Sunday. This marks the longest period in living memory that the Spreckels Organ has gone without playing! And there's more work ahead: impeller blades on the blower, while serviceable, are soon to be replaced in an operation that will not interrupt the regular concert schedule.
